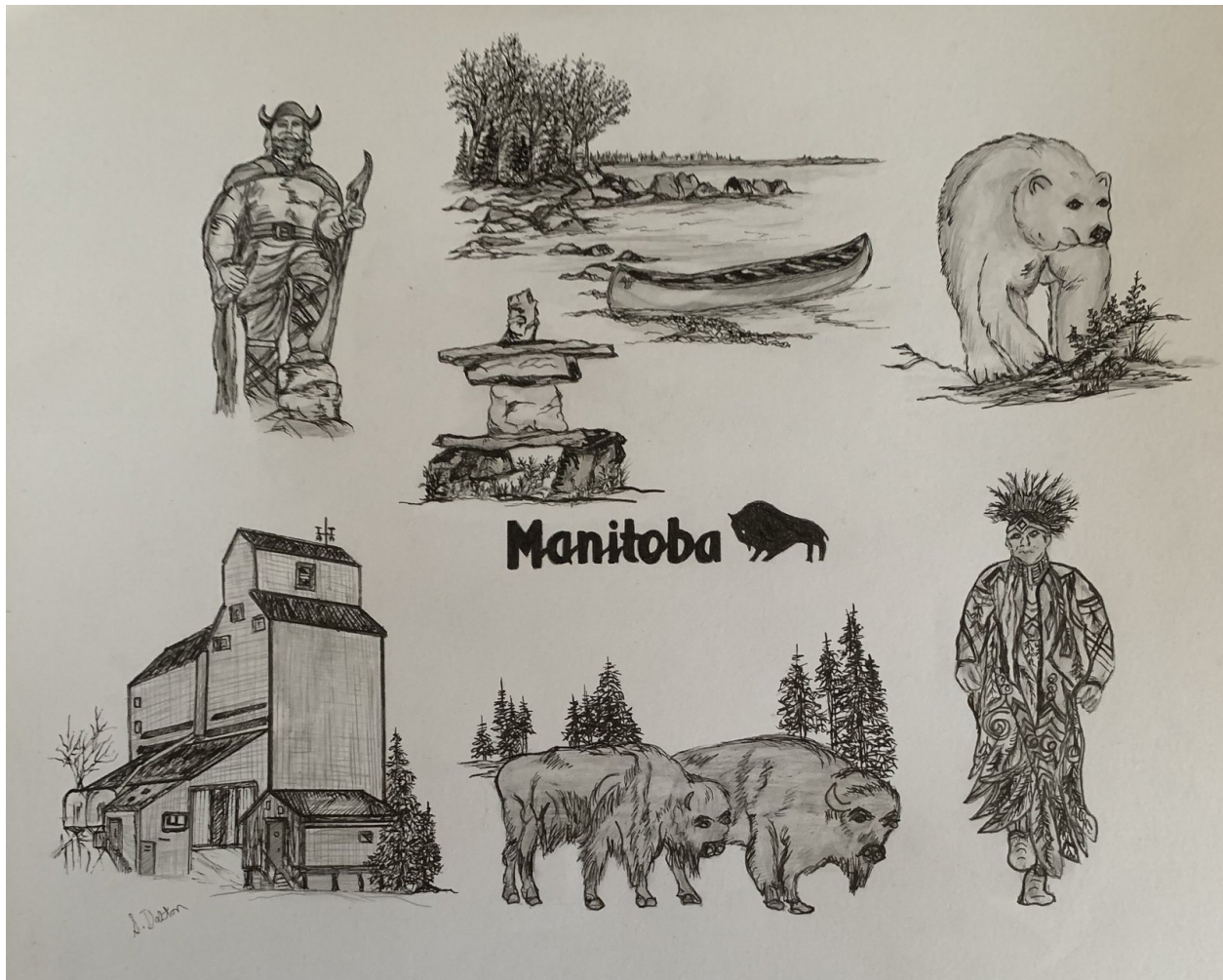

"CELEBRATION of MANITOBA," rich in culture, diversity, landscape and wildlife. Canada's central province, Manitoba has a lot of enticing attractions in the region, such as its many beautiful lakes, its world-class museums, and its unique festivals. Located on the shores of Hudson Bay, Churchill is a remote subarctic town where you can witness polar bears and beluga whales in their natural habitat. Manitoba covers 649,950 square kilometres with a widely varied landscape, from arctic tundra and the Hudson Bay coastline in the north, to dense boreal forest, lakes and prairie farmland in the central and southern regions. Grain elevators are a common site throughout Manitoba. Indigenous peoples have inhabited what is now Manitoba for thousands of years. Gimli's Icelandic culture is one of the many diverse cultures in Manitoba. Manitoba is home to wondrous creatures of all kinds — hundreds of bird species, huge herds of caribou, black bears, wolves, foxes, massive moose, bison, muskrats and dozens of other mammals including, of course, the great Canadian beaver. Bison are the largest land mammals in North America and one of Manitoba's most recognizable wildlife species.
